

## EN PRIMEUR: 2019 Burgundy En Primeur – RED WINES

**William Kelley**, RobertParker.com's man in Burgundy, gives a good indication of the quality of the vintage, as below:

**“This is a thrilling year for Pinot Noir**, delivering wines bursting with head-turning perfume and fresh, succulent fruit. Supple and enveloping, they are simultaneously serious and immensely charming, prompting Jacques-Frédéric Mugnier—who crafted some of 2019's most compelling wines—to remark that he had never before encountered **“a vintage that tasted so good, so young.”**

**“In short, 2019—is a superb vintage, and these are wines that all Burgundy lovers are going to want to secure for their cellars.”**

**“If the greatness of some vintages takes time to emerge, with others, it's immediately apparent, and that was the case in 2019.**

In style, they evoke a hypothetical blend of the succulence, charm and expressiveness of 2017 with the substance and concentration of 2015. Looking further back in time, I'm tempted to invoke comparisons with 1964: a ripe, rather powerful vintage nonetheless beautifully differentiated by site and endowed with considerable aging potential.”

**“2019 Summary – Another Great Vintage Ending in ‘9’ that was Hot and Very Dry yet Produced Fresh, Elegant and Concentrated Wines**

Yes, you read the summary headline correctly. I appreciate that it’s somewhat surprising that the vintage descriptors of ‘hot and very dry’ would appear in the same sentence with those of ‘fresh and elegant’ but that is exactly what happened in 2019. **Moreover, it produced some genuinely superb wines.”**

“When taken as a whole, there really isn’t much to bemoan in 2019, other than the inescapable fact that **quantities are down 20 to 40% from what they were in 2018.”**

**“I believe that the 2019s belong in any serious Burgundy collector’s cellar; indeed I believe that it would be a significant mistake to pass on them.”**

“If I had to choose just one vintage with which to compare 2019, I would have to go way back in time to 1966 or even 1949.”

**“I would strongly suggest that when the 2019s hit the market later this year that you buy a few and see for yourself what you think. If you choose well, I believe that you will be extremely impressed.”**

“Still, I can’t stress enough that great wines were made everywhere and the greatest terroirs, not surprisingly, produced the greatest wines. The magisterial Vosne, Morey, Chambolle and Gevrey grands crus did what they should have done in a fabulous vintage and produced potentially legendary wines. The best premier cru sites did as well and any number of them made it into the Don’t Miss category, which is typically completely dominated by grands crus.”

**“In sum, 2019 is absolutely a vintage that you want in your cellar, even if it’s in smallish quantities. I would advise to buy your favorites in whatever amounts that you can find and afford, and then cherry pick the rest. I will be doing the same so here’s wishing you every success!”**

## BOURGOGNE ROUGE-

**2019 Bourgogne Hautes Côtes de Nuits Rouge Le Prieuré, Domaine Aurélien Verdet @ £198 IB per 12 bottles (12 cases available)**

Ripe but agreeably cool aromas of violet, plum and a suggestion of earth precede solidly concentrated and **delicious middle weight flavors that exude a refreshing salinity on the clean and focused finale. This offers very good volume for the Hautes Côtes and as well as depth. Worth considering.**

## MERCUREY 1ER CRU-

**2019 Mercurey Rouge 1er Cru Clos des Myglands, Domaine Faiveley @ £215 IB per 12 bottles (10 cases available)**

Faiveley's 2019 Mercurey 1er Cru Clos des Myglands **has turned out beautifully**, wafting from the glass with aromas of cherries and raspberries mingled with woodsmoke, loamy soil and warm spices. Medium to full-bodied, **lively and charming, it's velvety and succulent, with fine depth at the core and a suave, elegant profile.**

## MARSANNAY-

**2019 Marsannay Rouge Champs Perdrix, Domaine Aurélien Verdet @ £300 IB per 12 bottles (6 cases available)**

A notably ripe yet still nicely fresh array combines notes of poached plum and spice with those of violet, warm earth and a hint of underbrush. **The succulent, round and seductively textured medium weight flavors exude a bracing minerality on the balanced and refreshing finish.** This is ripe but balanced.

## COTE DE NUITS VILLAGES-

**2019 Côte de Nuits Villages Aux Faulques, Domaine Jean-Marc Millot @ £348 IB per 12 bottles (5 cases available)**

Here too the nose is firmly reduced and tough to evaluate at present. Otherwise there is **excellent density to the larger-scaled flavors that proffer better depth and persistence.** This is a relatively powerful CdNV and a bit firmer as well.

## MOREY ST DENIS AND MOREY 1ER CRU-

**2019 Morey St Denis, Domaine Aurélien Verdet @ £465 IB per 12 bottles (10 cases available)**

Moderate reduction overshadows the fruit at present but there is otherwise good freshness and verve to the **delicious and nicely delineated medium-bodied flavors that exude equally good minerality on the balanced finale.** This is a quality Morey villages and worth checking out.

A mentholated top note is present on the overtly floral-suffused aromas of plum, dark raspberry and discreet earth wisps. **The succulent, delicious and caressing middle weight flavors that exude a refreshing salinity on the sappy, firm and well-balanced finale.** This is quite attractive and should drink well after only 4 to 6 years of cellaring. Worth considering.

## GEVREY CHAMBERTIN-

**2019 Gevrey Chambertin, Domaine Aurélien Verdet @ £465 IB per 12 bottles (12 cases available)**

This too is very fresh with its combination of very earthy plum-suffused aromas that display a hint of the sauvage. **The delicious and vibrant flavors are rich while retaining good delineation**, all wrapped in a youthfully austere, moderately firm and lightly rustic finale. **This too is quite good for its level.**

A more elegant nose speaks of black cherry, spice, herbal tea and soft earth nuances. Like the old vines cuvée, this is not super-dense, but the **delicious, sleek and vibrant flavors are shaped by very fine-grained tannins on the wonderfully refreshing and sneaky long finale**. This is very pretty and is also sufficiently forward that it could easily be enjoyed young. Lovely.

## CHAMBOLLE MUSIGNY-

**2019 Chambolle Musigny, Domaine Hudelot Noëllat @ £258 IB per 6 bottles (limited availability)**

Aromas of cherries, cassis, sweet spices, rose petals and loamy soil introduce the 2019 Chambolle-Musigny Village, a medium to full-bodied, **deep and concentrated wine that's lively and mineral**. From the usual eleven parcels, dotted around the appellation, **this is a fine success**.

## BEAUNE 1ER CRU-

**2019 Beaune 1er Cru Les Grèves, Domaine des Clos @ £264 IB per 6 bottles**

An earthier nose combines notes of red and blue pinot fruit, violet and soft spice nuances. There is even better volume to the intense and caressing yet powerful larger-scaled flavors that exhibit a taut muscularity on the stony, youthfully austere and **impressively persistent finish**.

**This is excellent and should prove to be very long-lived.**

The 2019 Beaune Grèves 1er Cru has a well-defined bouquet of dark berry fruit, light seaweed and oyster shell scents, and the 30% whole cluster lends a subtle tertiary aspect. The palate is medium-bodied with crisp, slightly chalky tannins. **This is very well structured, delivering palpable energy.**

The 2019 Beaune 1er Cru Les Grèves Vigne de l'Enfant Jesus unwinds in the glass with notes of plums, cassis, loamy soil, black truffle, spices and incense. Medium to full-bodied, velvety and layered, it's deep and concentrated, with bright acids, **ultra-refined tannins and a long, penetrating finish.**

This is the latest in a series of **superb renditions of this cuvée, and it may be the finest of them all.**

**NUITS ST GEORGES 1ER CRU-**

**2019 Nuits St Georges 1er Cru Les Crots, Domaine des Clos @ £339 IB per 6 bottles**

An ultra-fresh if restrained nose speaks of red cherry, currant and pungent earth that is trimmed in just enough wood to notice. The caressing but punchy and delineated medium weight flavors also brim with minerality that becomes more apparent as the balanced, youthfully austere and serious finish sits on the palate. **This solid effort** will need at least a few years to unwind.

**VOSNE ROMANEE 1ER CRU-**

**2019 Vosne Romanée 1er Cru Les Beaux Monts, Domaine Aurélien Verdet @ £450 IB per 6 bottles (6 cases available)**

A bright, cool and very spicy nose is comprised by markedly **floral elements that add a touch of elegance** to the purple fruit, black cherry and tea scents. **There is abundant minerality to the succulent and seductively textured medium weight flavors that possess a sophisticated mouthfeel that carries over to the refreshing, youthfully austere and firm finale** where the only nit is a trace of warmth.

Bouchard's 2019 Le Corton Grand Cru is **extremely promising, and I ordered several magnums directly after I tasted it.** Bursting with aromas of peonies, rose petals, blood orange and wild berries, it's medium to full-bodied, layered and incisive, its pungently perfumed core of fruit built around lively acids and fine, elegantly chalky tannins. **This is well worth a special effort to seek out.**

Wafting from the glass with notes of cherries, woodsmoke, dried flowers, licorice and loamy soil, it's full-bodied, bright and tightly wound, with real concentration and a **long, precise finish.**

**“The year’s best white Burgundies are as incisive as they are powerful, with bright acidity to balance their undeniable weight, and attentive producers excelled. In short, 2019—is a superb vintage, and these are wines that all Burgundy lovers are going to want to secure for their cellars.”**

“To my palate, they evoke a hypothetical blend of the 2012 vintage (for its texture and concentration, born of low yields), the 2017 vintage (for its ripe but lively acids) and the 2015 vintage (for its above-average alcohols and elevated levels of dry extract from ripe skins).

If one were to draw an analogy with a mature vintage, it would be with the 1989s.”

Aromas of pear, fresh bread and peaches preface the 2019 Bourgogne Blanc Les Champlains, a medium-bodied, **chiseled and saline wine that's bright and incisive.** From a parcel containing Pinot Beurot (the Burgundian name for Pinot Gris), it has turned out very nicely.

### **MEURSAULT 1ER CRU-**

**2019 Meursault 1er Cru Genevrières, Domaine Bouchard Père et Fils @ £381 IB per 6 bottles (7 cases available)**

A blend of two parcels, the 2019 Meursault Les Genevrières 1er Cru was the first to be picked by Bouchard in this appellation. The well-defined bouquet features touches of lemon thyme, walnut and smoke. The palate is balanced with fine acidity, fresh and focused. **The pretty, apricot-tinged finish fans out wonderfully and leaves residues of grilled almond and sesame on the aftertaste. Excellent.**

### **CHASSAGNE MONTRACHET 1ER CRU-**

**2019 Chassagne Montrachet Blanc 1er Cru La Maltroie, Domaine Fontaine Gagnard @ £480 IB per 12 bottles (12 cases available)**

The 2019 Chassagne-Montrachet Maltroye 1er Cru has a fragrant, chalk dust scented bouquet that opens nicely with aeration. **The palate is well balanced with a lightly spiced opening, touches of orange rind and marmalade lending a welcome tanginess.**

It might not be a long-term Chassagne, though **it is thoroughly enjoyable.**

**2019 Chassagne Montrachet Blanc 1er Cru Morgeot, Domaine Fontaine Gagnard @ £240 IB per 6 bottles (4 cases available)**

The 2019 Chassagne-Montrachet Morgeots 1er Cru, which comes from the La Grande Borne lieu-dit, has a generous, eucalyptus-tinged bouquet. **The palate is well balanced with a powerful opening, quite rounded in texture with touches of ginger stem and orange rind.**

Maybe it could benefit from a little more tension on the finish but there is certainly decent length here.

**CHABLIS GRANDS CRUS-**

**2019 Chablis Grand Cru Bougros, Domaine William Fèvre @ £285 IB per 6 bottles (5 cases available)**

A ripe and **beautifully layered nose** consists of notes of green fruit, citrus, iodine and mineral reduction. The powerful, rich and voluminous big-bodied flavors possess fine mid-palate density that coats the palate with sap before concluding in an austere, long and vaguely rustic finale.

This is an imposing Bougros **that should age effortlessly over the next decade plus.**

**2019 Chablis Grand Cru Les Preuses, Domaine William Fèvre @ £405 IB per 6 btls (3 cases available)**

This too could be from nowhere else except Chablis with its citrus-tinged aromas of tidal pool, white flowers and shellfish. The racy, intense and painfully intense larger-scaled flavors possess cuts-like-a-knife delineation on the bone dry and super-saline finish where a distinct bitter lemon quality slowly emerges.

This too offers a wonderfully broad range of classic Chablis elements that include mineral reduction, iodine, ocean breeze and quinine on the citrus-infused nose. **The racy, detailed and beautifully textured and focused flavors deliver outstanding length on the balanced, saliva-inducing and sneaky long finish.** This is also quite classy and if not quite as complete as the Preuses in 2019, it's close and with time in bottle, it may well catch its stablemate.

If Kimmeridgian could be distilled, it would likely smell exactly like the nose of the 2019 Les Clos with the additions of wet chalk, citrus zest and oyster shell. There is equally good delineation to the snappy, painfully intense and overtly stony large-bodied flavors that **deliver superb length on the balanced finale.**

This elegant and classy effort is also built on a base of almost pungent minerality and a wine that is **indisputably going to age effortlessly for years.**

## COTE D'OR GRANDS CRUS-

**2019 Corton Charlemagne Grand Cru, Domaine Bouchard Père et Fils @ £813 IB per 6 bottles (8 cases available)**

The 2019 Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru is **another success**, unwinding to reveal notions of pear, orange oil, warm bread, toasted almonds and fresh peach. Medium to full-bodied, deep and concentrated, **it's lively and mineral, with a long, saline finish**. This derives from holdings in the commune of Ladoix, above Bouchard's parcel in Le Corton in red.

Aromas of orange oil, white flowers, fresh pastry, smoke, pastry cream, confit lemon and ripe pears introduce Faiveley's 2019 Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru, a full-bodied, **textural and enveloping wine that's satiny and incisive, with tangy acids and a seamless, elegant profile**.

The 2019 Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru is **very promising**, exhibiting notes of orange oil, peach and pear complemented by hints of nutmeg and white flowers. Medium to full-bodied, **bright and layered, it's ample but precise, with tangy acids and a long, mineral finish**. As readers will remember, this bottling hails from the three terraces on the hillside above Bouchard's La Cabotte, their bottling from the latter—which adjoins Montrachet itself—being more muscular and powerful, whereas this cuvée is finer-boned and more ethereal.

Aromas of white flowers, fresh peach, toasted bread, mandarin oil and pastry cream introduce Bouchard's 2019 Montrachet Grand Cru, a full-bodied, layered and **multidimensional wine that's deep and concentrated, with racy acids, terrific mid-palate amplitude and a long, saline finish. Broad shouldered and powerful without being at all overbearing, it's an exemplary rendition of this celebrated site**.

The 2019 Montrachet Grand Cru has a complex bouquet of crushed chalk, mirabelle, apricot and light vanilla pod aromas, plus just a touch of white chocolate in the background. **The palate is well balanced with a fine bead of acidity, quite powerful and very well defined**. Orange zest, mandarin and lemon thyme notes feature on a **very long finish that fans out extremely well. Superb**.

## 2019 Vintage Report:

The winter was mild, with February and March temperatures above average leading to an early bud-break (2 weeks earlier than in 2018). April's temperatures were normal for the time of year, although a very hard frost on 5<sup>th</sup> April affected the Côte de Beaune, the Côte Chalonnaise and the Maconnais. Further frost scares between 13<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> April, and also in early May, were not as serious though there was some limited further damage. Poor weather in early June slowed the flowering, which had begun on 4<sup>th</sup>, and caused millerandage (irregular berry size and maturity) and some flowers to abort thereby reducing the potential crop. Peak flowering took place between 12<sup>th</sup> -15<sup>th</sup> June. The last week of June saw the first of two heatwaves with temperatures exceeding 40°C. July remained sunny with some localised hail in the Côte de Beaune and Côte Chalonnaise on 7<sup>th</sup> (minor damage) and 14<sup>th</sup> (more damage, particularly around Aloxe Corton). The second heatwave arrived in the third week of July and delayed the veraison (colour change of the grapes) so that full colour change was only achieved in late August. The hot dry conditions caused vegetation to shut down, especially amongst young vines in drier hillside terroirs. This situation was alleviated by decent rainfall in August that set the growing process in motion again. The overall consequence of these conditions was greatly reduced yields, particularly for Pinot Noir. The harvest began between 11<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> September (5 days later in Chablis) - some 90-95 days from flowering (therefore earlier than the 100 day rule of thumb) and was conducted in fine weather.

## Key Characteristics:

The principal characteristic was the severe lack of rain: over the course of the vintage, rainfall was 30% below average while, in the main, sunshine was abundant through the season. It is worth noting that the changing climate is resulting in earlier and earlier bud-break which increases the danger of frost damage, and higher average temperatures which drain moisture from the soil and lead to stress later in the year. The good news however is that, whilst quantities were reduced, the fruit was in great condition as there was no mildew and no rot; skins both for Pinot and for Chardonnay were thick and firm. As a consequence of the heatwaves, malic acids were very low but pH balances were maintained by the remaining tartaric acid giving the wines surprising freshness. 2019 is clearly one of the ripest recent vintages, alongside 2015.
